Twenty-five (25) credits, 20 as required by the State of Ohio, earned in Grades 9-12, are required for graduation.

In addition, students must:

- Complete a 120 hour community service requirement which includes 2 service immersion projects.
- Participate in four Interession (two weeks) experiential learning courses which include travel abroad, international & domestic service-learning, and on-campus and off-site academic instruction. Each interession equals a minimum of 70 hours of instruction.

**Graduates of 2024 are expected to only earn .75 interession credits due to COVID-19 therefore only 24.75 credits are required for graduation.*

CALENDAR

The school year is comprised of two semesters, each containing two quarters. Each quarter makes up 40% of a student's semester grade. Classes are block in format and rotate A and B Days. Each day is made up of four 80 minute blocks with bells 1-4 on Day A and bells 5-8 on Day B. Each day begins at 8:00am and ends at 2:45pm with an activity bell that lasts until 3:05pm.

CLASS RANK

Due to our rigorous college preparatory program and the small size of our senior class, Cincinnati Hills Christian Academy does not rank students numerically. We believe that a number is often misleading since small differences in grade point averages can produce significant differences in rank.

Cincinnati Hills Christian Academy uses a weighted grade point system based on a traditional four-point system.

Grade point averages are weighted as follows: Honors and VT courses are weighted a .5 quality point in the grade point calculation. Advanced Placement (AP) courses are weighted 1 full quality point in the grade point calculation. Grades of D or lower do not receive a grade bump.

THE CLASS OF 2023

The CHCA Class of 2023 consisted of 118 students who were accepted at 138 and matriculated to 49 different colleges and universities across the country and globally.

CURRICULUM

- CHCA offers 26 AP and beyond courses. Freshmen are not permitted to take AP courses and sophomores can choose one from five courses (AP European History; AP Human Geography, AP Music Theory, AP Statistics, AP US History). Admission into AP courses is selective and based upon teacher recommendation

Our program has opportunities for casual participants as well as the arts-focused student who chooses in-depth study and skill development. ROBOTICS

At CHCA, robotics is a critical component of our approach to STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math). Through classroom and multiple extracurricular opportunities, teachers, coaches, and industry mentors equip students with 21st century skills, bridging the gap between practical problems and creative solutions.
