

Sumdog Information Sheet


This summer, and throughout the upcoming school year, your child will be utilizing www.sumdog.com to help build and reinforce their math skills. This information sheet will help you log in and navigate the website.

Your student's assignment for Upper Elementary Math for the summer is to play for 600 minutes, or 10 hours throughout the summer. That averages out to be approximately 1 hour per week, or 10 minutes per day. If your student spends 10-20 minutes on Sumdog consistently, their skills will be reinforced, providing a solid foundation for math skill retention over the summer.

1. In your computer's browser, type www.sumdog.com into the address bar.



2. When you hit enter, you should see a screen that looks like this. Click "Log In"



3. Enter your student's username, password, and school code. Their username is their first initial and last name, their password is armlerder1 and their school code is chca like in the picture below. Then click "log in."

You should now see the following screen:



Your students may change several things in their adventures around the website.

The "Choose Skills" button will be usable after 3:00pm. Before 3pm, students will work on skills that either Sumdog or Miss Naberhaus have set for them.

If your student clicks the "Play World" button, they may choose to change their play experience to play robots or play other students in their class if they are online and playing the same game that your student is playing. If they leave it on world, they will play against students all over the world!

If your student hovers over the right or left side of the gaming screen, a gray area with an arrow will appear. Students may click on the arrows to navigate to different games. Games will slowly unlock as students answer more questions and level up through the game.

In the games, students will answer questions to earn gold coins. Students spend coins in the houses (which open after 3pm) for furniture, clothing, hairstyles, and items for their pets. The more correct answers a student gets, the more coins they earn. There will be challenges throughout the summer that students may complete to earn more coins.
