
Sixth Grade Summer Reading Assignment Summer 2018

This summer we would like you to read *Fish in a Tree* by Lynda Mullaly Hunt and complete the Sixth Grade Goal sheet.

You should also read a book of your choice. This book should be at a sixth grade reading level (for example, you may not choose *Middle School: Worst Years of my Life* or similar novels for this assignment. These types of novels, while at a sixth grade **interest** level, are not at a sixth grade **reading** level) and should be at least 150 pages in length. To find a book at a sixth grade reading level, you can use www.scholastic.com/bookwizard to search your book. You want the **Guided Reading Level** to be somewhere between a W and a Z. (See example image below). During the first week of school, you will be writing and presenting a review of this book for the class. More details on the review will be given when school starts.

Directions: After reading *Fish in a Tree,* it is time to set some goals for the coming year! Think carefully about areas where you want to see growth in yourself in the coming year!

Academic Goals: This goal is about what you want to achieve in your classes this year. A good goal is to make small improvements in things such as your study habits, timeliness (finishing work on time), participating in class discussion, etc. A poor goal would be to say, "I want to get all A's this year," or something similar. Ask yourself the following questions: What is hardest about school for me (critical thinking, staying organized, managing my time, etc)? What is one small step I can take to make this easier? Write your response in the space below:

Social Goals: This goal is about how you can grow yourself as a person. A new year brings a new opportunity for change. This year, how can you become more of who God made you to be? For example: Do you need to work on manners? Do you need to work on thinking before you speak? Do you need to work on being accepting of others? Reflect on last year and come up with one small thing you can do when school starts this year. For example: Do you need to apologize to someone? Do you need to say "Hi" to people in the hallway?
