

## CHCA Immunization Summary for Child Care and Pre-School Attendance 2018-2019

REQUIRED VACCINES	IMMUNIZATION SCHEDULE: CHILD CARE/HEAD START & PRE-SCHOOL ATTENDANCE
<b>DTaP/DT</b> (Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis)	Four (4) doses of DTaP or DT, or any combination.
<b>Hep A</b> (Hepatitis A)	Two doses of Hepatitis A. The first dose of Hep A vaccine should be given between 12 months and 23 months of age. The second dose should be given 6 to 18 months later.
<b>HEP B</b> (Hepatitis B)	Three (3) doses of Hepatitis B. The first dose is given between the first and Second month of life. The second dose must be administered at least 28 days after the first dose. The third dose must be given at least 16 weeks after the first dose and at least 8 weeks after the second dose. The last dose in the series (third or fourth dose), must not be administered before age 24 weeks.
<b>Hib</b> (Haemophilus Influenza Type b)	Three (3) or four (4) doses depending on the vaccine type, the age when the child began the 1st dose and the last dose must be after 12 months. <b>OR</b> One (1) dose if given on or after 15 months of age.
<b>Influenza (Flu)</b>	Influenza (Yearly)*  *Two doses given at least four weeks apart are recommended for children aged 6 months through 8 years of age who are getting an influenza (flu) vaccine for the first time and for some other children in this age group.
<b>MMR</b> (Measles, Mumps, Rubella)	One (1) dose of MMR administered on or after the first birthday.
<b>OPV, IPV</b> (Polio)	Three (3) doses of OPV or IPV or any combination of OPV or IPV.
<b>PCV13</b> ( Pneumococcal conjugate)	Give first dose at 2 months, Give second dose at 4 months, Give third dose at 6 months, Give fourth dose between 15 and 18 months
<b>RV</b> (Rotavirus)	If Rotarix is used, Give a 2-dose series at 2 and 4 months of age. If RotaTeq is used, administer a 3-dose series at ages 2, 4, and 6 months. If any dose in the series was RotaTeq or vaccine product is unknown for any dose in the series, a total of 3 doses of RV vaccine should be administered.
<b>Varicella</b> (Chickenpox)	1 dose of Varicella administered on or after the first birthday.

**Vaccine Notes:**

- Vaccine doses are only considered valid if administered according to the most recent version of the *Recommended Immunization Schedules for Persons Aged 0 Through 18 Years* or the *Catch-up Immunization Schedule for Persons Aged 4 Months through 18 Years Who start late or Who Are More Than 1 Month Behind*, as published by the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices.
- Vaccine doses administered  $\leq$  4 days before the minimum interval or age are valid (grace period). Doses administered  $\geq$  5 days earlier than the minimum interval or age are not valid doses and should be repeated as age-appropriate. If MMR and Varicella are not given on the same day, the doses must be separated by at least 28 days with no grace period.
